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DISCLOSURES IN REAL PROPERTY TRANSACTIONS

While these disclosures relate mainly to residential property resales, some may also be applicable to the initial sale of subdivided interests as noted in this section and further discussed in Section IV Remember that sellers and real estate agents must make the disclosures necessary to avoid fraud, misrepresentation or deceit

1. PARTIES

Foreclosure: Owner shall pay all loan obligations, property taxes, association fees and any other obligations which could lead to a foreclosure action Owner shall notify Broker and tenant within ten (10) days after receipt of notice of any trustee's sale or judicial foreclosure related to the Property, or as otherwise prescribed by law
